General Managers Message

The summer continues to roll along with an abundance of activities here at High Meadows. July events included 60 ladies participating in the Ladies Member-Guest, 62 attendees at the Big Band Dinner & Dance, and 17 children attending Kids Week. August promises to be just as busy with our Member-Guest being held Thursday-Saturday, August 2 - 4. Currently we have 49 teams signed up to play. We also have two very exciting projects beginning Monday, August 6th! These projects will be a replacement of the fencing around the pool and renovation of the deck around the clubhouse. Our pool deck will also be expanded on the driving range side during the project. Our clubhouse deck will be replaced, new railings added, and an expansion of the deck on the Golf Shop side of the Clubhouse. Deck renovation will also include a fire pit addition. Both projects are funded by the Living Tree fund. Thank you to the members who have contributed!

Our greens are recovering from the outbreak of the Annual Bluegrass Weevil which occurred mid-June. The weevils feed on the roots of the lower cutting height Poa annual and Bent grass, deteriorating the roots of the plant resulting in turf loss. The greens have been sprayed three times and received fertilizer applications. Although there still remains some evidence of damage, the grass is now replenishing and recovering. Several other items to keep in mind while playing golf. Make sure to fix your ball mark on the greens. We ask you to make sure to replace all divots in the fairway, tee and rough areas. The Bent grass will grow back if replaced properly. Please replace the turf back into the divot if possible and step on the divot so mowers and cart traffic will not disrupt. If the divot is not replaceable, you should use sand provided in the bottles on the carts. We also ask golfer to please utilize the cart paths around all tees and greens, making sure to keep all four tires on the cart path. Carts should also remain at least 30 feet away from all greens surfaces. These steps will go a long way to keep our course in excellent condition and making the round more enjoyable for you and your fellow golfers.
