Tip of the Month: Playing to your strengths

There is such a thing as being too close to the green after laying up on par fives. It is often better to have a full shot left, than say a 40 to 50 yard feel shot. Therefore, your first job is to determine an ideal distance for your next shot. Let's say you are comfortable hitting a shot from 100 yards. Figure your distance from where your drive finishes to the distance you are comfortable with (100 Yards) factoring in roll and terrain. As long as you hit this shot well, it should finish in your desired yardage for your next shot. Please check with the golf shop for any questions with your game!!

Dear High Meadows Member,

On Saturday, September 22, 2018, the Annual Fall Membership Meeting was held. A vote was taken during this meeting to repair and rebuild the bunkers and tee boxes. The combination project of bunkers and tees was approved by a 2/3 majority.

Additional information for the membership was provided by Carolyn Harrell informing the membership of the possibility of a "Loss Assessment" claim that can be made on their home owners policy. Those members interested in pursuing a Loss Assessment claim should review their policy and/or speak to their agent. If covered you may recover up to \$1000.

If, after discussing this type of coverage with your agent, you'd like to file a claim the Club will bill for the assessment in such a way as to satisfy Assessment claim with your insurance company. Your October statement, will show the assessment either in a lump sum of \$4,214 or we will begin your monthly payments of \$352. Please notify the office of the billing method you prefer.

If your insurance requires a copy of the bill for the repair assessment, we will provide you with an invoice in the amount of \$1,968 for the Bunker Storm Damage Repair Assessment only. All insurance companies are different and may have different requirements, it is our understanding that the insurance company will only pay on assessments caused by storm or other damage not for improvements. Please let us know what you need and we will provide you with whatever you need to satisfy your insurance company.
